“WARNER AMBUSHES THE COMPETITION”



The 2011 ACES season wrapped up in Greenville, Ohio at the 66th running of the Peace Pipe Enduro by the Treaty City Motorcycle Club. The ACES/District 15 co-sanctioned event, with the help of ideal weather leading up to the race, drew over 170 riders. After 80 miles of log strewn woods, cornfields and creeks, the overall went to an up and coming rider from Indiana.

Jesse Warner (GG), out of the 250A class, ambushed the 9 rider AA field and scribed his name on the rotating “Peace Pipe” trophy for 2012. Warner, the 2010 NEPG B Champion and current point leader in District 15, dropped 10 points for the day, earning his first Overall enduro victory. Warner started the day by dropping a point at the first check while his nearest competitors all dropped two. ACES stalwart Rodney Judson and his BETA was the first ACES regular to adapt to the western Ohio terrain and matched Warner’s tally through the next three checks. At check #5, the first emergency, Warner squeaked

in at 1:55 while Judson went 2:08 and relinquished another point. Judson then mounted a charge at the last check and picked up a point on Warner, but it was too little too late and Warner claimed the victory.

The battle for bragging rights in the B class, proved not to be as close as local KTM pilot Dan Foureman dropped 19 points with the next six riders in the B standings mired at 26 or 27 off. These top 7 riders swapped places throughout the day and it wasn’t until check #7 that Foureman’s 4:41 bested his closest competitor’s by 3 or more points. With his victory, Foureman earned enough points to claim his A card for 2012.

Besides the overall battles, the standings in several ACES classes came down to the wire and were decided at Treaty City. In the A ranks, KTM pilots Mike Molnar (200A), Brian Rickard (Open A), Marty Kehlmeier (Vet A), and Scott Klamfoth (SSr. A) all placed at or near the top of their respective classes, securing their 2011 class titles. Husaberg pilot Jeff Johnson claimed Berg’s sole class championship as he entered with a 1 point lead and no margin of error. For the second year in a row, Johnson prevailed as he finished second to the KTM of Brent Floyd, yet one position ahead of Wayne Perdue (KTM) who was vying for the ACES class championship but ended up 3 points shy.

The ACES organization would like to thank all of the riders that came out to support our series. Treaty City is always a fitting end to our season as we mix with the District 15 riders who are more than willing to play spoiler to someone’s title hopes. Congratulations to Jesse and the rest of the Indiana gang for your efforts and thanks for coming. I think our AA guys will step up their game and be leery of another ambush in 2012.
